**SCOPE AND CONTENT:** Miscellaneous Manuscript Files (MMF) are small collections typically containing only a folder or two of materials. This folder contains a survey map of the West Run Plantation of the Barrow family in southeast Frederick County which is based on the legal settlement of the estate in 1831. The survey is accompanied by a road map sketched on wax paper that appears to indicate the location of the estate. Both maps are reproductions based on historical records.

**BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL:** West Run Plantation was the home of the Barrow family. Members of the family who lived on the estate include Thomas Barrow, Sr. (d. 1774), Captain William Barrow, Thomas Barrow (son of Captain William Barrow), and William Barrow, Jr. These family members occupied three different houses on the estate over time. The location of these houses is identified on the map. The survey notes that the home of Thomas Barrow was built by Hessian prisoners of war during the Revolutionary War.
