**SCOPE AND CONTENT:** Miscellaneous Manuscript Files (MMF) are small collections typically containing only a folder or two of materials. This folder contains a notebook, the first pages of which list the names of individuals from Civil War military units from Ohio, Virginia, and Pennsylvania. The remaining pages record carpentry work done for Godfrey Miller, Wesley Falls, Mr. Sellers, Mr. Hill, and for a paper mill.

The provenance of this notebook is not clear. While the inside front cover has an inscription which reads "Miles B. Snyder Book," there is no record of a Miles B. Snyder living in Frederick County during this period. However, within the notebook are copies of estimates for carpentry work signed by John W. Grim. Mr. Grim is listed as a carpenter living in Winchester in the 1870 U.S. Federal Census.
