**SCOPE AND CONTENT:** The James V. Hutton Jr. Collection contains work produced by Mr. Hutton about historic figures and events in Frederick County, Virginia. It also includes information from the 1860 U.S. Slave Census. The materials also include news clippings, scrapbooks, and papers, as well as information on World War II service personnel.

**BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL:** James V. Hutton Jr. was born in 1927 and grew up in the White Hall area of Apple Pie Ridge in Frederick County. Later, he taught school in the county and served as Assistant Superintendent for Instruction until his retirement in 1982. Hutton received undergraduate, graduate, and post-graduate degrees from University of Virginia. He served in the Pacific in WWII. His memberships included the VFW, the Old Stone Church Memorial Association, and the Virginia Historical Society. Hutton also wrote a number of books and articles on events and prominent figures in Frederick County. He died on May 30, 2019.
