SCOPE AND CONTENT: The materials in this collection concern the history and restoration of Hawthorne, a historic home in Winchester, as well as information about the families who lived in the house.

BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL: "Hawthorne," currently located at 610 Amherst Street in Winchester, Virginia, was originally part of the Glen Burnie tract owned by James Wood. He sold a parcel of land to his son, James Wood, in 1765, who built a house which was originally known as Federal Hill.

In 1803, Wood conveyed the estate to Lawrence Washington, who then sold it to Alfred Powell in 1811. The house was then owned by J. Tidball and Col. Angus McDonald. His wife, Cornelia Peake McDonald, wrote a diary of the Civil War while living at "Hawthorne."

Over the years, the house has undergone many renovations, including by the Lewises, who owned the house.
