SCOPE AND CONTENT: The Dana MacBean Collection contains research materials collected by MacBean as part of research into the *James E. Taylor Sketchbook*, which is a collection of first-hand sketches of the Shenandoah Valley in the Civil War. The items include maps, papers, and images, some of which contrast present day locations with sketches done by Taylor.

BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL: Dana MacBean is a topographer, cartographer, photographer, and historian who has researched and published a study of the *James E. Taylor Sketchbook*.

James Edward Taylor (1839-1901) was born in Cincinnati, Ohio. He studied to be an illustrator in New York. At the start of the Civil War, he served two years as a sergeant in the Tenth New York Volunteers. During this period, he began making illustrations of the War and, in 1863, the *Illustrated Newspaper* hired Taylor as an artist. He drew illustrations for General Philip Sheridan's Shenandoah Valley campaign in August 1864, and later followed the armies of Generals Benjamin Butler and William Tecumseh Sherman.
