**SCOPE AND CONTENT:** Miscellaneous Manuscript Files (MMF) are small collections typically containing only a folder or two of materials. This folder contains a record book kept by the Harrison & Morton Club of Apple Pie Ridge and includes its articles of association, meeting minutes and lists of members.

Also included in the folder is a separate enclosure containing a booklet listing apple growers of Frederick County, Virginia published by the Farmers and Merchants National Bank of Winchester (n.d.) and a postcard (ca. 1942) of the Handley Library in Winchester. Both items were found enclosed in the record book.

**BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL:** The Harrison & Morton Club of Frederick County, Virginia was created to support the Republican ticket of Benjamin Harrison and Levi Morton for the 1888 presidential election. After Harrison was elected, the club continued to exist in the interest of promoting the Republican Party locally.
