SCOPE AND CONTENT: This inventory contains Strader's notes and activities at Handley High School, Glen Burnie/James Wood, Jr., awards, correspondence, Kernstown Battlefield Foundation, Cedar Creek, Jordan Springs, French & Indian War Foundation, area Civil War, the Kurtz building, rural landmarks survey, Mrs. Lee's journal, Winchester Little Theatre, local people, and places.

BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL: Eloise Correll Strader was born on August 9, 1918, at Philippi, West Virginia. She was a mathematics teacher at John Handley High School for over 40 years. Ms. Strader also served as director of the Winchester Little Theater, president of the Winchester-Frederick County Historical Society, and was active in the Cedar Creek Battlefield Association, and Preservation of Historic Winchester. She was also responsible for editing and republishing, through the Winchester-Frederick County Historical Society, the historical books of Garland R. Quarles, and was editor of *The Civil War Journal of Mary Greenhow Lee*. Ms. Strader was named Elizabeth C. Engle Historian of the Year in 2009 and received the Stewart Bell Jr. Literacy Award in 2012 for her work on *The Civil War Journal of Mary Greenhow Lee*.

Ms. Strader died on October 19, 2014, the 150th anniversary of the Battle of Cedar Creek, at the age of 96. She is buried in Mount Hebron Cemetery, Winchester, Virginia.
