**SCOPE AND CONTENT:** Miscellaneous Manuscript Files (MMF) are small collections typically containing only a folder or two of materials. This folder consists of a ledger with entries recording the receipt of stock certificates by shareholders in the Winchester, Welltown and Berkeley Turnpike Company. There are also three stock certificates, a note concerning the transfer of stock from a deceased shareholder and a newspaper clipping concerning the estate of another deceased shareholder.

**BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL:** The president of the Winchester, Welltown and Berkeley Turnpike Company was James T. Clevenger, a prominent landowner of Frederick County. His brother-in-law, John W. McKown, who was treasurer of the company, was also the secretary and treasurer of the Winchester and Martinsburg Turnpike Company.
